Ministry Showcase 2010: Passport to Faith, Family & Joy!



arishioners walking through our gathering space during the first two weekends in October were pleasantly surprised to see it transformed into a festive travel-related motif. Why were there suitcases with balloons attached scattered throughout the area? What were the posters and displays all about? The underlying message was an invitation to further deepen our faith journeys through service in parish ministry.

The last Notre Dame Ministry Showcase Weekend was held in 2005. Since then the number of active ministries has expanded to more than 70 – too many to effectively feature in one weekend. And in those five years, the parish has grown to over 2,200 families, may of whom were surely not aware of all the various opportunities to serve here at Notre Dame.

Pastoral Associate Jean Pankow says that this year's Ministry Showcase took nine months of planning by a "team of extraordinary people." Members included Michele Ciottone, Patty Gant, Pat Gawdun, Maryann Johnston, and Susan Kerwin. As early as January, 2010, selecting a date for the Showcase proved to be a challenge! The parish calendar was so full that the first two weekends in October were the only slots available in 2010.

Jean reports that the planning team explored a number of different themes for the Showcase, with the unanimous choice being **ND Ministry: Passport to Faith, Family & Joy!** The team felt that this reflected beautifully that our faith life – both as individuals and as a parish family -- represents a true *journey*, dynamic and always moving forward. The theme also reinforced how important involvement in ministry is to that journey.

The planning process itself was a journey, giving our parish ministries a chance to work with their members and with each other in creating their displays and illustrating their messages on posters and handouts.

The Ministry Showcase, a significant undertaking for all involved, had two important goals: first, to create awareness among parishioners of the many different ways to

Our Parish's Newest Author: A.J. Cunder

s language arts specialists lament the gradual deterioration of writing skills due in part to prolific texting and little reading, eighteen-year-old parishioner A. J. Cunder



offers positive proof that literary talent is not only alive but flourishing among our youth. A graduate of Whippany Park High School, Anthony Joseph (A.J.) Cunder is the author of the 500-page science fantasy novel *The Silver Talon*. He is presently a freshman at Seton Hall University, where he is one of sixty in the Honors Program at the university.

The Silver Talon tells the story of young hero Arius and his dragon who travel through the perilous mazes of the mystical land of Farahdin and clash with the evil Contemno, the wicked usurper of the throne. Intrigued by the sophisticated charting of the narrative and its lively prose, Notre Dame's Father Justin commended the author for his handling of the moral basis of the conflict. A. J., he said, created another world of honesty and loyalty in which

a Jesus figure stands up against wickedness. Father Justin described A.J. as a sensitive and thoughtful young man who had used his God-given talents in a positive and entertaining way.

When not writing or studying, A.J. is a volunteer firefighter and also has a black belt in Tae Kwon Do. He practices sword fighting with his friends and loves anything to do with medieval times. A.J. intends to major in English and continue writing. "There will probably be more books to follow The Silver Talon in the series," A. J. promises. "I'm already about sixty pages into the sequel. The most rewarding part about writing is seeing other people who enjoy my



writing." One special proof of his gratitude is his decision to donate proceeds from the sale of his novel to the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation. He himself has lived with Type 1 diabetes since the age of one-and-a half.
